FOR CRITICAL WORKER PUPILS

This Guidance will be updated weekly and amendments made where necessary.

Government Guidance

Numbers 1 to 4 must be in place in all schools, all the time.

Numbers 7 to 9 must be followed in every case where they are relevant.

1. Minimise contact with individuals who are unwell by ensuring that those who have coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, do not attend school



Measures in place

- RA created by NYCC and adapted to suit South Otterington CE Primary school.
- This addresses direct risks associated with COVID-19
- Measures will minimise risks for children and staff.
- Risk Assessment will be emailed to staff, Governors, parents and is available on the website.
- Staff have acknowledged by email they have received and read.
- Governors have acknowledged by email they have received and read.
- CEO acknowledged by email received and read.
- Online course has been completed by ALL staff: Prevent COVID-19.
- Long hair to be always tied back, no jewellery to be worn.
- Children must not attend school if they have any symptoms of coronavirus.
- It is advised that if any pupil has **ANY** illness they are kept at home as they will be placed in the Medical Room with a member of staff wearing PPE if they are unable to keep to 2m Social Distancing until they are collected, which should be immediately.
- Any staff with any symptoms will be asked to leave the site and make an immediate appointment for a Key Worker test.

2. Clean hands thoroughly more often than usual

3. Ensure good respiratory hygiene by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach



- Children and staff will wash hands regularly for 20 seconds with soap.
- Children and staff will wash their hands on arrival, after playtime, before and after lunch and before home-time.
- Children and staff will wash their hands after sneezing, coughing or touching their noses.
- Catch it, kill it, bin it, promoted through school.
- Lidded bins in each classroom.
- Posters of 'Catch it, Kill it, Bin it' and other appropriate posters eg Social distancing reminders visible across the site.
- Soap is available at all sinks.
- Tissues are available in all classrooms.
- Children should use hand moisturiser on return home, to eliminate any dryness caused by regular hand washing.
- Posters of good hygiene and handwashing practice across the site.
- Cleaning box available in all Bubbles.
- Staff and pupils reminded not to touch faces, eyes nose.
- Children encouraged to keep hands below their shoulders.
- Staff tabards will remind all pupils and staff about handwashing and social distancing.

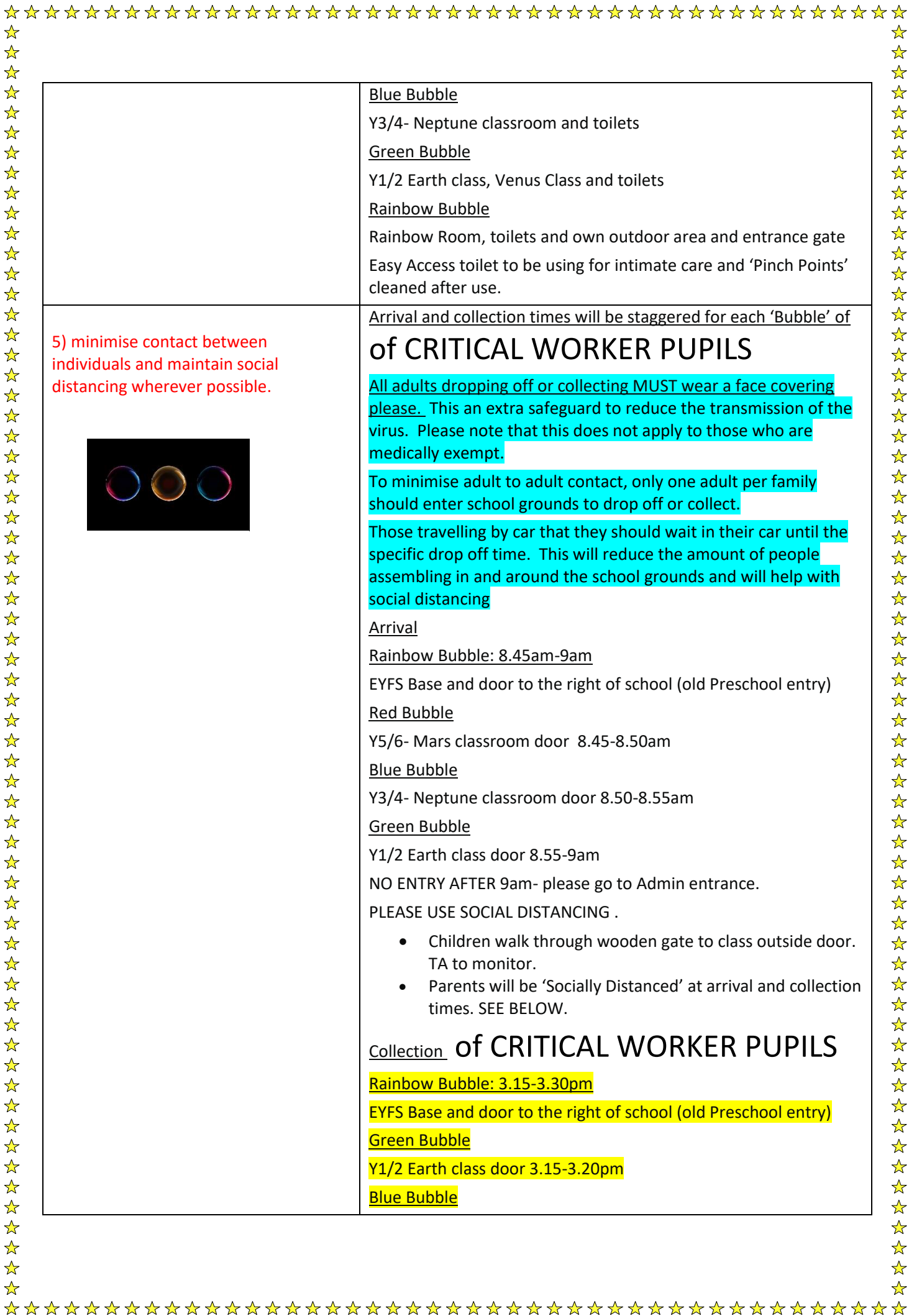
4. Introduce enhanced cleaning, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces often, using standard products such as detergents and bleach

- Cleaning in classrooms will be frequent as agreed.
- Cleaning box available in all Bubbles.
- Teachers will stand behind pupils to view work.
- Toys will be cleaned at the end of the session.
- Play equipment will be wiped down at the end of each lunchtime.
- All classrooms will have clear surfaces so work areas can be wiped down regularly with antibacterial spray.
- Toilets will be regularly cleaned at 'Pinch Points'
- **Children must not bring anything into school**, except their red reading bag, children will receive their own resources which will be in a pencil case and kept in school.
- PE kit and trainers to be worn on the day of PE: Neptune =Monday, Earth=Tuesday, Red=Wednesday. (EYFS are not included in this during this term)
- Water bottles to stay in school each day and will be washed with hot soapy water at the end of the day
- No resources brought in from home except red reading bags.
- First Aid kit will be available in each classroom
- Toilets will be regularly cleaned at 'Pinch Points'
- Play equipment may be used and must be wiped down at the end of the session.

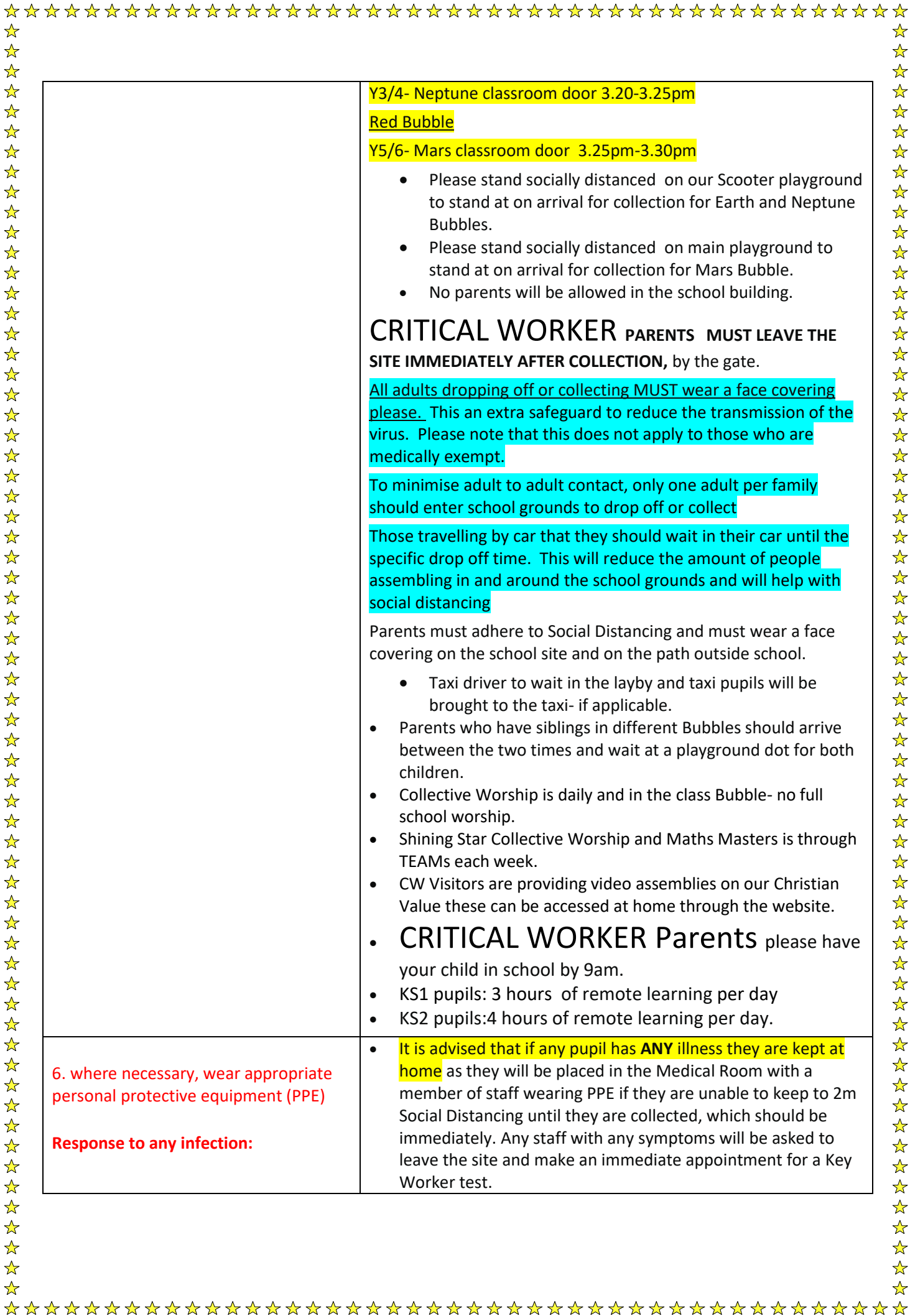

Information about our school day FOR CRITICAL WORKER PUPILS/REMOTE LEARNERS

Curriculum

- CHILDREN WILL COMPLETE WORK IN SCHOOL OR THROUGH REMOTE LEARNING
- Critical Worker pupils: Children will have a Collective Worship each day in school.
- REMOTE LEARNERS: should also say the Lord's Prayer in Makaton each day.
- VISITOR COLLECTIVE WORSHIP IS PROVIDED ON VIDEO FOR ALL PUPILS.
- MENTAL HEALTH AND WELL-BEING WILL BE A FOCUS FOR ALL PUPILS IN SCHOOL AND AT HOME. TEACHERS WILL ENDEAVOUR TO SPEAK TO ALL REMOTE LEARNERS EACH WEEK.
- Critical Worker pupils: Water Bottles will be left in school.
- Critical Worker pupils: Children to wear PE kit on their PE day.
- Critical Worker pupils: Social skills will be revisited when necessary.
- Critical Worker pupils: Our usual Behaviour Policy is in place.
- Critical Worker pupils: Teachers will give verbal feedback to pupils when possible
- Critical Worker pupils: Children will have their own desk and resources- NO PENCIL CASES TO BE BROUGHT INTO SCHOOL. EACH CHILD HAS THEIR OWN SCHOOL PROVIDED PENCIL CASE.
- REMOTE LEARNERS: Teachers will speak to children at home each week.
- Critical Worker pupils: A short PE session will be a compulsory part of the school day eg Joe Wicks, Go Noodle. PE lessons will be outside where possible in school.
- REMOTE LEARNERS: Parents are encouraged to ensure Home Learners also do the 15 minute PE slot.
- Critical Worker pupils: Hair must be tied back at all times.
- ALL PUPILS: Children will continue to learn how to keep themselves safe during the pandemic eg, handwashing, social distancing.
- Critical Worker pupils: Forest school to be included in the curriculum from 25.9.2020.
- REMOTE LEARNERS: An outdoor activity is planned by staff to do in their garden or outdoor space.

School lunches for CRITICAL WORKER PUPILS

Lunchtime will be staggered.

*11.45am-12.10pm: Rainbow BUBBLE- different location

*11.45pm-12.10pm: Green BUBBLE

*12.10-12.35pm: Blue Bubble

*12.35pm-1pm Red Bubble

- If children have left the hall and the tables are cleaned the next Bubble may arrive for lunch.
- Cutlery and cups will be set out for each setting by lunch staff.

- Usual online payment system in place for school lunch payments on MCAS.
- We encourage all children in school to have a school lunch.
- Packed lunch boxes/bags will be wiped down on arrival at school.
- Packed lunch trolley to be wiped down at lunchtime and at the end of the day.

Arrival and Collection of CRITICAL WORKER PUPILS



All adults dropping off or collecting MUST wear a face covering please. This an extra safeguard to reduce the transmission of the virus. Please note that this does not apply to those who are medically exempt.

To minimise adult to adult contact, only one adult per family should enter school grounds to drop off or collect.

Those travelling by car that they should wait in their car until the specific drop off time. This will reduce the amount of people assembling in and around the school grounds and will help with social distancing

PARENTS MUST CALL/EMAIL IF A KEY WORKER CHILD IS NOT ATTENDING SCHOOL BEFORE 9am

- Face coverings are advised on school site.

Collection

- Please stand socially distanced on the Scooter playground to stand at on arrival for collection for Green and Blue Bubbles.
- Please stand socially distanced on the main playground to stand at on arrival for collection for Red Bubble.
- No parents will be allowed in the school building.
- Please do not use the end of the car park entrance to lay-by to turn your car around. Pedestrians are in this vicinity.

PARENTS MUST LEAVE THE SITE IMMEDIATELY AFTER COLLECTION with their child in a socially distanced manner.

- Please do NOT use the PLAY EQUIPMENT.
- PLEASE LEAVE THE SCHOOL SITE STRAIGHT AFTER COLLECTING YOUR CHILD.

- Taxi driver to wait in the layby and taxi pupils will be brought to the taxi.
- IF A PARENT HAS A CHILD IN TWO TIME ZONES THEN THEY SHOULD ARRIVE AT THE TIME BETWEEN THE TWO.
