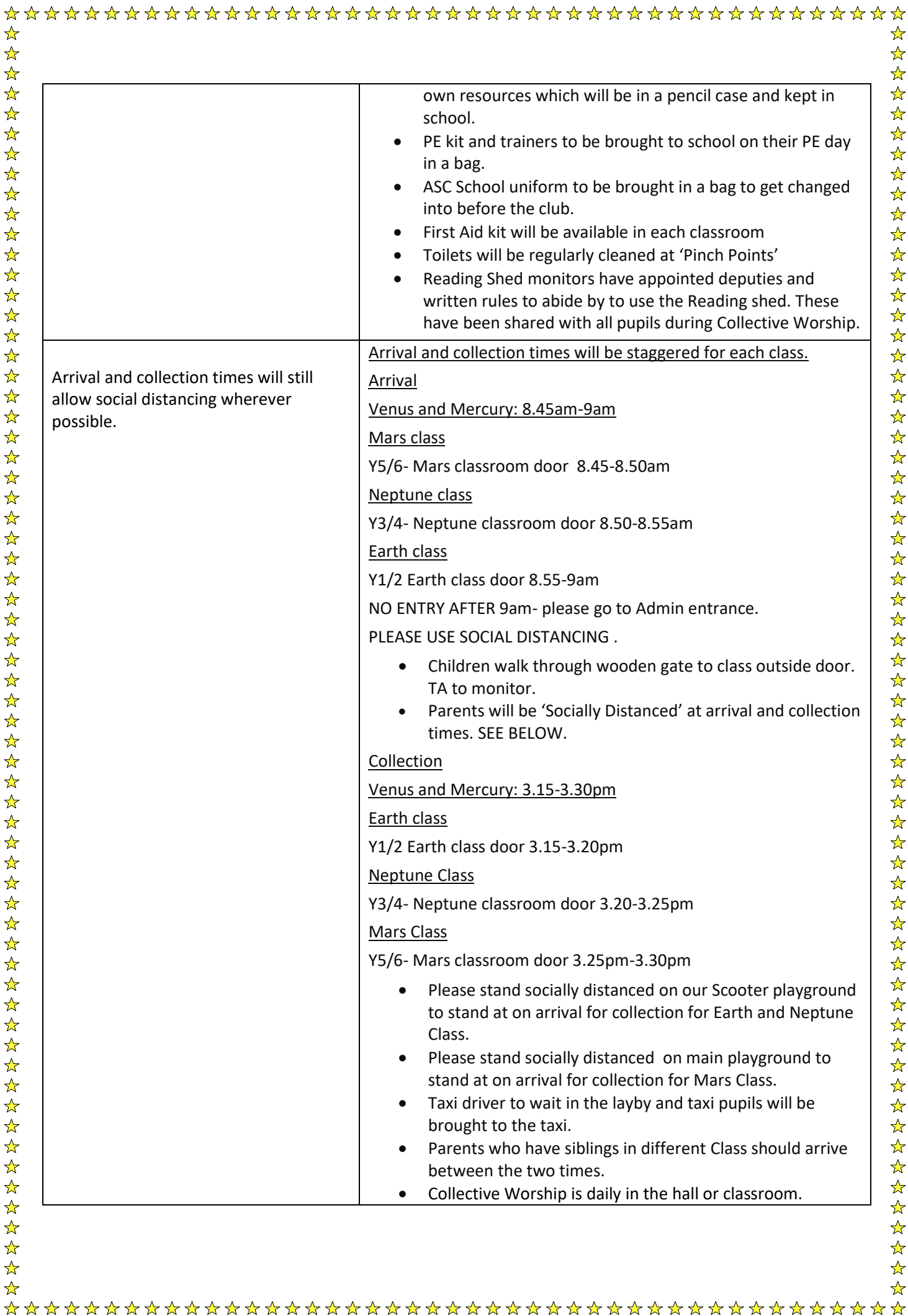

Risk Assessment in place for September return of pupils- updated 4.1.2022

- RA created by NYCC and adapted to suit South Otterington CE Primary school. New RA v.4 (1.9.2021)
- This addresses direct risks associated with COVID-19
- Measures will minimise risks for children and staff.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Risk Assessment will be emailed to staff, Governors, parents and is available on the website. • Staff have acknowledged by email they have received and read. • Governors have acknowledged by email they have received and read. • CEO acknowledged by email received and read. • Online course has been completed by ALL staff: Prevent COVID-19.
<p>Minimise contact with individuals who are unwell by ensuring that those who have coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, do not attend school</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Long hair to be always tied back, no jewellery to be worn. • Children must not attend school if they have any symptoms of coronavirus. • It is advised that if any pupil has ANY illness they are kept at home as they will be placed in the Medical Room with a member of staff wearing PPE if they are unable to keep to 2m Social Distancing until they are collected, which should be immediately. • Any staff with any symptoms will be asked to leave the site and make an immediate appointment for a COVID-19 test.
<p>Clean hands thoroughly more often than usual</p> <p>Ensure good respiratory hygiene by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children and staff will wash hands regularly for 20 seconds with soap. • Children and staff will wash their hands on arrival, after playtime, before and after lunch and before home-time. • Children and staff will wash their hands after sneezing, coughing or touching their noses. • Catch it, kill it, bin it, promoted through school. • Lidded bins in each classroom. • Posters of 'Catch it, Kill it, Bin it' and other appropriate posters eg Social distancing reminders visible across the site. • Soap is available at all sinks. • Tissues are available in all classrooms. • Children should use hand moisturiser on return home, to eliminate any dryness caused by regular hand washing. • Posters of good hygiene and handwashing practice across the site. • Cleaning box available in all classes. • Staff and pupils reminded not to touch faces, eyes nose. • Children encouraged to keep hands below their shoulders. • Open windows will allow natural ventilation
<p>Enhanced cleaning, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces often, using standard products such as detergents and bleach</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cleaning in classrooms will be frequent as agreed. • Cleaning box available in all classrooms • All classrooms will have clear surfaces so work areas can be wiped down regularly with antibacterial spray. • Toilets will be regularly cleaned at 'Pinch Points' • Open windows will allow ventilation • Children will not need to wear face coverings. • Children should not bring anything into school, except their red reading bag and PE kit , children will receive their

<p>Where necessary, staff will wear appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE)</p> <p>Response to any infection:</p> <p>Contacts from a school setting will only be traced by NHS Test and Trace where the positive case or their parent specifically identifies the individual as being a close contact</p> <p>Any outbreak will be contained by following local health protection team advice</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It is advised that if any pupil has ANY illness they are kept at home as they will be placed in the Medical Room with a member of staff wearing PPE if they are unable to keep to 2m Social Distancing until they are collected, which should be immediately. <p><u>New Information from the 18.1.2022 Risk Assessment</u></p> <p>Individuals who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature</p>	<p>It is crucial that people isolating with COVID-19 wait until they have received 2 negative rapid lateral flow tests on 2 consecutive days to reduce the chance of still being infectious.</p> <p>For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.</p> <p>The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace.</p> <p>If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest. Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.</p> <p>The default self-isolation period continues to be 10 days, and you may only leave self-isolation early if you have taken 2 rapid lateral flow tests and do not have a temperature in line with guidance</p>

Curriculum

- Children will have creative curriculum sessions - these will be outside where possible. We will be working on our usual South Otterington curriculum.
- Mental Health and Well-being will be a focus at some point in the day, our Well Being Counsellor will work in school each Friday during the Spring term.
- Children will have a Collective Worship each day.
- We will have a Shining Star Collective Worship on a Friday
- Children will bring their school PE kit in a bag on their PE day.
- Social skills will be revisited when necessary.
- Our usual Behaviour Policy is in place.
- Teachers will give verbal feedback to pupils when possible.
- Children will have their own resources provided by school.
- Hair must be tied back at all times.
- Children will continue to learn how to keep themselves safe during the pandemic eg, handwashing, social distancing.
- Forest school to be included in the curriculum
- Children are encouraged to have a school lunch.
- Curriculum focus weeks are planned for this academic year.
- Parent Helpers are working in school during the week and will wear a face covering when working with pupils.
- School strongly encourages parents and other visitors to take a lateral flow device (LFD) test before entering the school
- Occupied spaces will be well ventilated and a comfortable teaching environment maintained
